Chasing The Beating Heart of God



Thump, thump, thump...hearing the sound of a baby's heartbeat for the first time can change one's life forever. My name is Liz Galloway, and about 2 years ago I had the honor of becoming a volunteer here at the Pregnancy Support Center. I along with two other ladies, Yvette and Dorothy, have been given a special privilege of running the ultrasound machine due to the fact we are all nurses. I don't think I could have known when I was studying to be a nurse that the Lord would have a higher calling in store for me—like saving unborn babies!

When I learned about how one needed to be a nurse to run the machine my heart leapt, and I asked Monica if I could be trained. She stated that they would be purchasing a new machine, and with that a training would be provided, so I could learn and join the team. I lived in Amarillo at the time, and for a week during the training I would drive to and from Pampa everyday. This was a sweet time, I would pray and sing at the top of my lungs... preparing my heart and mind for this new adventure. I would think of all the lives I would get to reach and hopefully bless—not fully understanding the battle for life that is being waged in this amazing place daily. Every time we walk a mom back to the room, have her lie down and expose her precious belly—we get to see how the Lord is knitting together an unborn baby so beautifully in her womb. We see His personality as the baby jumps, rolls, or even hiccups through the process. We do several things in our scan; check to see where the baby is-- making sure it's in the right spot, measure the size of the baby--in order to give a round about due date, and lastly we listen for the baby's heartbeat. We jokingly call this chasing the baby's heart, because the baby will inevitably twist or spin as we try to place this little line over the heart, so the machine can capture the sound. I get so excited through this process, the other nurses know this, because I am so bubbly telling the mom how amazing their precious little one is. The moms sometimes have their other children with them, and they get to hear their sibling's heartbeat—oh, how their faces light up when they hear it too. The repetitious thumping has brought even the toughest of men in the room to tears. A lot of times the mom is scared to see and hear what is on the screen, but the peace of God descends like a dove with that sound, and changes almost all fears and despair to peace and hope. I am so glad to be on the front line of this battle for life, and with a team of believers that are also being held to a higher call. I ask everyone reading this to pray for wisdom in our scans and for the continuing peace of God to rest in that little room where life is being found and heard.
