Wade decision that legalized abortion on demand and took place in the Supreme Court on January 22, 1973.

The Pregnancy Support Center was established in 1992 to be **hope and help** to combat the war waged on the most vulnerable. We are here to offer love, truth and essential needs to those facing unplanned pregnancies. All of our services are free and confidential.

Also, in conjunction with this time and season we begin our **Baby Bottle Benefit**. Our slogan being **“Your Change Can Change A Life”**. During this fundraiser we ask that baby bottles be filled with change and returned to the PSC or your church. Baby bottles are available at the PSC and the churches participating.
